



E-FILING IN THE SIXTH JUDICIAL CIRCUIT

PINELLAS COUNTY

1. Attorneys must electronically file pleadings and papers in new and existing cases effective April 1, 2013. This applies to the:
 - a. County Civil,
 - b. County Small Claims,
 - c. Circuit Civil,
 - d. Circuit Civil Appellate, and
 - e. Family law Divisions (excluding dependency cases).
2. The procedure for submitting proposed orders, proposed final judgments, letters or correspondence to a **Judge** is not changing at this time. Such documents may not be electronically filed through the E-Filing Portal but must be submitted according to the Court's directions. Attorneys should continue to provide hard copies to the Court, including sufficient copies for conforming, and stamped, addressed envelopes for distribution of orders. The requirement to submit a foreclosure packet has not changed. See the resources below for additional information.
3. E-filing in the Probate Division will continue in accordance with Administrative Order 2013-006.
